Lighting the Advent Candle of Joy

One: Isaiah 61:10 says: "I will greatly rejoice in God, my whole being shall exult in my God; for God has clothed me with the garments of salvation, God has covered me with the robe of righteousness, as a bridegroom decks himself with a garland, and as a bride adorns herself with her jewels." The last two Sundays we have reflected on the Advent themes of "hope" and "Peace" This Sunday, we center on "Joy."

Today is the Gaudete Sunday—the 3rd Sunday of Advent. It is a joyous celebration that is set up to provide relief or a break from the more reflective rituals, as well as focus away from all of the hardships in our midst. The pink candle that we light this morning reminds us to be encouraged, to lean into a softer sentiment.

Many: Let's light the candle of joy!

(the pink candle is lit)

*CALL TO WORSHIP

One: When God restores our fortune, our dreams will come true.

Many: We will sing "Glory!" to our God; we will rejoice in our Savior's birth.

One: Our mouths shall be filled with laughter; joy shall chime from our lips.

Many: God has made it clear: those who serve are God's children.

One: Then we will proclaim: 'look what God has done':

Many: so others will know beyond any doubt how the Holy One has blessed us with hope.

One: We wept- now we will cheer "Joy! Joy!" We were lost - now we will run home laughing. Many: For God has picked us up where we fell; God has kept the promises made so long ago.


